

HELICOBACTER PYLORI BREATH TEST PATIENT INSTRUCTIONS

What is the purpose of this test?

The ¹³ C-urea Breath Test checks to see if an organism called *Helicobacter pylori* is present in your stomach. *Helicobacter pylori* is an important factor in stomach and duodenal ulcers. The results of this test will help your doctor decide if you require further treatment or investigations.

What does the test involve?

The ¹³ C-urea Breath Test is accurate and non-invasive. There are four steps to this test.

- 1. You will be asked gently to blow through a straw into two test tubes.
- 2. You will be given a small drink of citric acid in which a tablet of ¹³ C-urea is dissolved.
- 3. Wait for 30 minutes.
- You will be asked to blow into another two test tubes.

These four test tubes containing your breath samples will be sent to a laboratory for analysis. Your doctor will receive the results within five working days.

How to prepare for the test?

Prior to the test

- No antibiotics for at least 4 weeks.
- No proton pump inhibitors for at least 14 days.

Somac – Pantoprozole

Losec – Omeprazole

Zonton – Lansoprazole

• **No** H₂ antagonists for 24 hours.

Zantac – Ranitidine

Tagamet - Cimetidine

Famox or Pepcidine - Famotidine

If you are unsure whether any medications you have taken recently will affect this test, please check with your doctor.

This test requires you to be fasting.

- Morning appointment not to have eaten since the night before. You may drink water but no breakfast, tea or coffee.
- Afternoon appointment Eat a light breakfast (tea & toast)
- No lunch
- Nothing to eat for at least 3 hours. You may drink water.

How much does the test cost?

There is a charge of \$105 to be paid.

Where do I go for the test?

The test is available at the main laboratory.
